In pursuance of the proclamation of the President of the Republic of Texas up^d the 15 February 1839 directed to the Chief Justice of the several Counties. I James W. Smith Chief Justice of Travis County have proceeded to lay off this County of Travis into Militia Beats which are as follows that is to say.

Beat N^o 1.

Commencing where the road leading from Nashville to the City of Austin strikes the County line of Travis thence follow the road until it strikes Congrus avenue in the City of Austin thence along the avenue to the River Colorado, thence down the river to the lower line of Dockruss League, thence continuing the course with the lower line of said league to Onion Creek, and all with and north west of said boundary shall be included into & form Beat N^o 1.

Beat N^o 2

And all that Country between beat N^o 1. & Walnut Creek shall be included into & form Beat N^o 2.

Beat N^o 3)

And all below Walnut Creek and above the lower line of Travis County on the east of Colorado River within the boundaries of Travis County shall be included into & form Beat N^o 3.

Beat N^o 4.

And all that Country on the west side of the River above the lower line of Travis County and below the line of Beat N^o 1 shall be included into and form Beat N^o four.
